

BSBI Meetings

Each year the BSBI organises field meetings throughout Britain and Ireland that are designed for general interest, for training in identification skills (at all levels) and to help record the flora of a site, area or habitat. Meetings at a local level are organised by vice-county recorders or local groups. The main meetings are advertised on the BSBI meetings web page and in the BSBI Yearbook, whilst local meetings are advertised on the vice-county web pages, in the BSBI meetings diary and in local group newsletters. Meetings in the main programme are primarily for members, though non-members are very welcome if there is space, and local meetings usually welcome anybody who is interested.

New Field Projects

The BSBI will be developing new projects, which may include grid square surveys, monitoring important plant species, surveying best local sites, visits to targeted habitats, refinding species apparently lost from hectads and recording for local Floras. Field meetings will be organised to help with these projects, to teach beginners the skills needed to identify and record plants, to support recorders and just to show off interesting plants and their habitats.





Recording urban habitats is likely to feature in some country projects. Two species that are scarce in their native habitats are spreading in towns: Left *Polycarpon tetraphyllum* (Four-leaved Allseed). Right *Gnaphalium luteoalbum* (Jersey Cudweed).

Do come along on one of our botanical excursions. They cater for all levels and there is always time to explain features of a plant to beginners. For further information about the BSBI meetings see the web pages, or contact your country field secretary or vice-county recorder.
